Submit the following 60 days prior to rotation:

1. Letter of Intent addressed to:

2. School Certificate/Letter allowing you to participate in an outside or international rotation. Whenever applicable, you will be responsible for your visa requirements.
3. Certificate of Good Standing from your school.
4. One 2x2 or Passport Size picture
5. Medical and Laboratory Examinations
 - a) Chest X-ray report (not older than one year)
 - b) Proof of vaccination or protective titers from the following:
 - i) Hepatitis B screening: HBsAg and anti-HBS
 - ii) RPR
 - iii) Anti HCV
 - iv) Varicella (or proof of recovery, such as titers)
 - v) HIV screen
6. Proof of International Health Insurance Coverage
7. Clinical Observership and Processing Fee (non-refundable): USD\$ 500.00 (per 4 week rotation)

A reference code will be given from the Accounting Office to acknowledge receipt of payment. After which, all documents will be processed for the Clinical Observership.
